

LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

"Then King David went in and sat before the Lord, and said: Who am I, Sovereign Lord, and what is my family, that you have brought me this far?" 2 Samuel 7:18

We send off another year with a deep sense of God's mercy. At the beginning of 2024, our team was blessed with the opportunity to participate in IFES' European Staff Consultation. When we shared with the other movements about the things that are happening in Bulgaria, we heard the same question repeatedly: "What did you do to achieve these results?". Perhaps while reading this annual report, you will ask yourself the same question, so I have decided to tell you what we also told our European colleagues. The truth is that we have done nothing more than serve faithfully, pray, and not give up even when we don't see results. We looked for new ways to live out our calling. The fruit of our ministry is due entirely to God's work among us.

This year BCSU celebrated its 30th birthday at our national forum "City on a Hill". Leading up to and during the conference, we told the history of BCSU in photos on social networks. It was inspiring to see where God's work began and how far it has reached in the academic world of Bulgaria. A story from the pages of BCSU illustrates well the drastic difference we are witnessing today:

14 years ago our colleagues Craig and Tanya (Craig is now part of BCSU's Board of Directors) moved to Sofia to help revive the student work there. They started English clubs, Bible studies, and all sorts of events with the hope of seeing dedicated students raised up who would actively participate in God's mission in the university. A year later, they invited about 20 students to a Christmas party at the BCSU office, bought them small gifts, wrapped them, prepared homemade food, decorated the office, prepared a

message for the holiday, played music and waited - all in vain. On that December day, not a single student responded to the invitation. Craig and Tanya choked back tears and continued to look for ways to reach these students, minister to them, and invite them to sit at the feet of Jesus. Today, there are 176 students in the group chat for BCSU Sofia, 10 student leaders, 4 groups that meet each week with over 50 students, 2 volunteers, 6 interns in the "Barnabas" Program, countless meetings and events for students, and students who are clearly dedicated to God's mission.

BCSU is in a season of abundant fruit and all the glory for this belongs to our faithful and good Lord. He is the true Director of every ministry, He is the Good Shepherd and King of all kings, He has all power and uses it to serve us and clothe us in His righteousness. We don't know what's coming. Perhaps the fruit will multiply, perhaps our faithfulness will be tested again, but we believe that whatever God has prepared, it will draw us closer to Him and teach us to love Him and trust Him more and more.

1. NUMBER OF DROUPS IN BCSU - 12:

- 9 student groups in 5 cities: 3 in Sofia, 2 in Plovdiv, 1 in Veliko Tarnovo, 1 in Burgas and 2 in Varna.
- 2 groups for international students in 2 cities: 1 in Sofia and 1 in Varna.
- ✗ 1 group for graduates in Sofia.

2. NUMBER OF STUDENTS:

This fall we had about 128 actively engaged students in these groups, which is 37% MORE than last year. A total of 187 Bulgarian students and 35 international students came to at least one event organized by BCSU in the fall, where God's Word was shared. 18% of these students are not yet followers of Jesus and 28% ARE NEW to BCSU.

4. NATIONAL EVENTS DURIND

THE YEAR:

- We held a National Forum "City on a Hill", which was attended by about 150 people from the different generations of students who have been part of BCSU. The event was held in two languages to welcome international students and guests from BCSU's history to celebrate the 30th birthday of the Movement with us.
- 27 students received leadership training during the "Sent by the King" Leadership Conference.
- We organized 2 Inductive Manuscript Bible Study Camps "Trilogy" on the book of Revelation. This year, reservations for these camps filled up within hours.
- We held a National Alumni Meeting this fall in Uzana on the theme Kingdom Relationships.
- We organized a summer project "Who will you be?" in partnership with the student movements in England and USA, which took place in Tryavna, as well as several evangelistic events in Sofia and Varna.

- We organized the second annual "Come and See: Festival of Opportunities" in partnership with the Evangelical Alliance, where various ministries in the country had the opportunity to present their goals and activities.
- We held a "Barnabas" conference, where the three participants from the previous year officially completed their internship with BCSU. Two of them went on to become volunteers and one continued her participation as a second level intern in the "Barnabas" Program.
- For the first time in Bulgaria, we organized the "Mark Drama" a 90-minute production in which the audience experiences every event in the Gospel of Mark as eyewitnesses, as the play is acted all around them. About 300 people came to the two events in Sofia.

5. LOCAL INITIATIVES::

- We have held evangelistic events studies on the Gospel according to John "Uncover", Alpha groups, Christmas and Easter parties with messages from the Word, Thanksgiving for international students, movie nights, an escape room event on the theme of "The Resurrection of Christ", Arabic night for international students, DIY day, game nights, hikes and more.
- In Sofia, we organized an event with prayer stations to celebrate the World Prayer Day for IFES students.
- We organized a total of 4 regional leadership days during the year in Sofia and Varna on the theme: gospel, worship and prayer.

★ Besides the Barnabas Program, 16 students meet individually with a Team member, volunteer, or other student for discipleship and mentoring for spiritual growth.

6. OTHER SIDNIFICANT EVENTS:

- ★ We have published a total of 35 new articles and interviews on the BCSU "Missio Dei" blog.
- We developed new Bible study material on the book of Hosea.
- We launched new promotional materials for the movement in the form of bottles, key chains, hoodies, t-shirts and socks.
- Our team participated in the conference for IFES teams in Europe and sent representatives to the IFES World Assembly , where the 75th anniversary of the foundation of the movement was celebrated.
- The newest member of the BCSU team (Nikoleta Yordanova) went through the training for new workers " Young Staff Network".
- At the beginning of the fall semester, the BCSU team invited an IFES representative for an evaluation of their work and practical steps for growth and development.




